

Fairview Church of the Brethren Fall Council

November 3, 2024

Moderator, Dale Brinegar opened the meeting with scripture reading from Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 and prayer.

The minutes from the November 12, 2023 Council meeting, and the July 14th, 2024 Special Council meeting were passed out to church members prior to this meeting along with written reports from the Church Board, the Deacon's, the Nurture/Witness Committee, and the Steward Committee. Alice Brinegar made a motion, seconded by Ashley Brinegar, to accept those reports as presented. Motion carried. A summary of the reports are:

Deacon's Report

- They sent several sympathy cards and memorials were given to three families in the loss of their loved ones. A memorial service was held in remembrance of loved ones lost in the last year.
- Five new members were joyfully welcomed into the church and four little girls were dedicated.
- Four young people were given Bibles, two new drivers were gifted key chains, and one retiree was recognized.
- The Deacon's gather joys and concerns on a weekly basis, write a synopsis of the morning service for those unable to attend, and encourage prayer for a person or couple from the congregation each week.
- They anointed several individuals, and presented a blanket and check to a local family with an ailing child.
- · Cards are sent for birthdays and other life events.
- Communion was held four times.
- They hosted a Friendship Dinner in May.

Nurture/Witness Report

- Nurture events included:
 - Hosted youth game nights including an all church bowling party and a service project making lasagna for Lasagna Love. Took some youth to Winter Jam and to a Casting Crowns concert.
 - The men meet monthly for Bible study and breakfast, and the ladies had an opportunity to attend Favored Women and a few women's gatherings at church.
 - Gifted carnations to the ladies on Mother's Day, and muffins and ink pens to the men on Father's Day.
 - Hosted an ice cream social and variety show in conjunction with the VBS program, as well as two grab-and-go dinners and a bake sale held as fundraisers.
 - A 12 week Bible study was led by Pastor Terry Chapman.
- Witness events included:
 - Partnered with Iowa Food Bank on a monthly basis.

- Other outreach activities included tying blankets for "Project Linus", collecting
 quarters for "Heifer International, collecting food donations for the Lord's Cupboard,
 collecting monetary donations for the Moulton-Udell back to school bash, collecting
 tee-shirts to make jump ropes for shoeboxes, and collecting items and monetary
 donations for the Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes.
- Several individuals routinely volunteer their time to work at the Lord's Cupboard.
- Looking ahead, the Committee will be accepting donations of deer meat that will be processed and given to the Lord's Cupboard.

Steward Report

- Church maintenance:
 - Selix Lawn Care provided snow removal and landscaped around the fence by the parking lot to make mowing easier.
 - Hayes Tree Service trimmed trees at the church at no charge. A thank you card and gift certificate was sent to them.
 - Chris Muszinski replaced the faucets in the fellowship hall.
 - Don Hunt did work on the sound system and ran new wiring to the amp in the fellowship hall.
 - The playground was completed and dedicated.
 - Baty's Electric installed ceiling fans in the fellowship hall and office, and a ceiling light in the women's restroom.
 - The Zach Mason family provided lawn mowing this past summer.
 - The church was pressure washed and the back door was repaired.
 - The new entry and foyer doors will be installed soon. There are plans to redo the entry floor when the weather permits.
 - Gravel will be added to the main parking lot to help smooth it out and they plan to gravel the west side of the overflow parking lot.
 - Materials have been ordered for new closet doors in the fellowship hall. They will be installed this winter.
 - New ceiling fans will be installed in the preschool room and nursery.
 - The lighting in the parking lot is not adequate. McGill Electric has given an estimate of \$3,000 to put a pole by the green fence with a spot light that can be turned on with a light switch

Farm

- Beans were planted on the church farm and have been harvested. They were hauled to Troy Elevator in Blakesburg by Rick Probasco at no charge. A thank you note and gift certificate was sent.
- The church hay was baled and purchased by Dale Brinegar.
- Corn will be planted on the church farm in 2025.

Treasurer's Report by Cindy Koehler

Cindy went over the report explaining how the report is structured and stated the church is financially sound. Dale Brinegar made a motion, seconded by Dean Penner to accept the treasurer's report as presented. Motion passed. A copy of the report is on file.

Business

- The proposed 2025 Church Board Slate and Deacons were presented to Council for approval.

 - e) District Conference Delegate unfilled (2025-2026) Note after the meeting Cande Batterson and Tiffany Muszinski volunteered to be delegates.
 - f) Annual Conference Delegate unfilled (2025)

Tiffany Muszinski moved, seconded by Ashley Brinegar to accept the slate of officers and deacons. Motion passed.


- 2) The Church Board brings the recommendation to call Barton VerEllen as part-time pastor at Fairview. Dale Brinegar made a motion, seconded by Darrell Koehler, to accept four absentee ballots. Motion passed. After the paper ballots were tabulated, it was found that with an over 75% favorability vote as required by the church constitution, Bart was extended the invitation to pastor Fairview.
- 3) Bethany Seminary has a program, Certificate of Achievement in Ministry Studies (CAMS) that is a six course program designed to provide a means for ministers new to the Church of the Brethren to complete coursework focused on Brethren identity and ministry. Alice Brinegar made a motion, seconded by Dean Penner, to pay \$550 towards the cost of the CAMS program for anyone from the congregation interested in pursuing this study. Motion passed.
- 4) The 2025 proposed budget was presented by Cindy Koehler. With no changes requested from church members, Dean Penner made a motion, seconded by Ashley Brinegar, to accept the 2025 proposed budget as presented. Motion passed.

With no further business, Ashley Brinegar made a motion, seconded by Ryan Brinegar to adjourn the meeting. Motion passed. Bart VerEllen thanked the congregation for the opportunity to be Fairview's next pastor and dismissed the meeting with prayer.
